Spring 2010 Robotics Competition Mission Object Details

The Spring 2010 EARLY Robotics Competition mission objects are 36 nickels, 36 quarters, & 36 pennies representing the United States of America Founding **Documents**. A nickel represents the **Declaration of Independence**, a quarter represents the **Constitution**, and a penny represents the **Bill of Rights**. The following information is provided for the **Documents**.

The Founding **Documents** are represented by coins.



36 Nickels, 36 Quarters, & 36 Pennies are used for the mission



A Nickel represents
The Declaration Of Independence.



A Quarter represents
The Constitution.



A Penny represents The Bill of Rights.

- The mission objects are nickels, quarters, & pennies.
- The mission objects are referred to as Documents.
- There are 108 mission objects required for the challenge: 36 nickels, 36 quarters, & 36 pennies.
- A nickel represents the **Declaration of Independence**.
- A quarter represents the Constitution.
- A penny represents the Bill of Rights.
- The value of the mission objects is approximately twelve dollars.
